

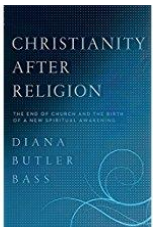

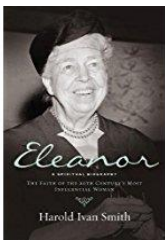
Pastor's Corner

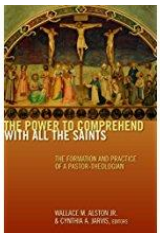
Christianity after Religion (Harper Collins, publisher)

I am in the middle of this book by Diana Butler Bass. Dr. Bass offers a “fresh interpretation of the “spiritual but not religious” trend...and offers a hope-filled plea to see and participate in creating a fresh, vital, contemporary way of faith that stays true to the real message of Jesus.” (from the jacket cover of the book)



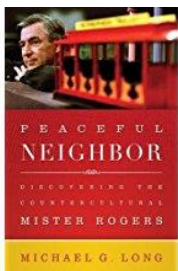
Eleanor: A Spiritual Biography-The Faith of the 20th Century's Most Influential Woman (Westminster John Knox Press, publisher)

The book delves into aspects of Eleanor Roosevelt's spirituality that fueled her “commitment to the rights of all people marginalized in American society. Eleanor Roosevelt took seriously Jesus' words and despite her life of privilege, she made the needs of those on the margins her priority.” (from a summary of the book on the jacket cover)

Peaceful Neighbor: Discovering the Counter-cultural Mister Rogers (Westminster John Knox Press, publisher)

Guidelines for Distribution of Produce from Community Garden: 1) the garden workers to be responsible for the consumption and distribution of the fresh produce; 2) recipients of Food Bags on the day the Food Pantry is open (3rd Tuesday of month) may be offered fresh produce, if it is available; 3) members of the “church family” or the “community” may pick up available fresh produce on Wednesday evenings, when workers are at the Garden. Lifeline Screenings in August

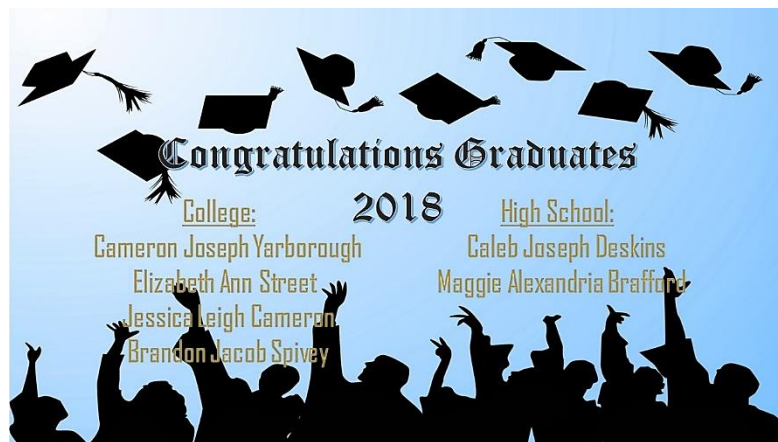
