Message from the Pastor

During this busy time of holidays and travel, I wanted to offer you all a moment of peace and rest that you might not be willing to do for yourself. It seems like there is never enough time, too many tasks to be completed, too many people relying on you to do what needs to be done. I understand those anxieties and sometimes they burden me as well. But know that the weight of the world is not on your shoulders, you can take a deep breath and know that all is well.

So, rather than boring you all with a story or an anecdote, I thought that a perhaps more important use for this platform would rather be to charge you all to do something for your self-care. I am not asking for much from you, 15 minutes is all. Set your phone down, turn off the T.V., and if your family is around, ask them to join you in this simple act. We have lost the power of silence, the power of waiting for God to speak and listening without distraction. So, my charge to you is simple, read this short Psalm aloud and sit and rest for 15 minutes in silence. Listen to your thoughts, listen for God, listen to the soothing tones of your breath, and, perhaps most importantly, rest. The world can wait for 15 minutes; all will be well.
