Message from the Pastor

As some of you may know, I have been growing vegetables in a garden for the past 6 months or so. This is the first time I have tried to do something like this before, and it has been an extremely enlightening experience so far. I have always felt that the natural world has a great deal of wisdom to share with us, and watching plants grow and bear fruit has taught me several lessons that I thought I might pass along to you all. I think the first lesson I would like to share with you all is that it is okay just to try new things. I started this project with no real training or expertise and yet I was able to grow around 10lbs of cucumbers, 5 quarts of cherry tomatoes, several watermelons, and numerous peppers and onions. Sometimes we can psych ourselves out and think something is too complicated or that we are not good enough to try, and the reality is when we just put ourselves out there and try things, even though we might not do them perfectly, we do a lot better than we think. The second lesson I would like to share is the natural world is much more resilient than perhaps we like to give it credit. One week I went away for a retreat, and although it had been watered some, it was clear that because of a drought in the area, my plants had needed more water than they had received. I feared when I saw them that they might be too far gone, but I watered them anyway, and in a day or two of work and effort, they recovered and continued to produce even though they had appeared near death. The natural world around us that we are charged to be good stewards of appears to be in bad shape, but it can recover. God has made this world strong and resilient; we just have to be willing to take small steps to care for it and help it recover. It's not too late. The final lesson I would like to share is on the idea of abundance. As I mentioned before, I have been blessed with a large harvest that, in many ways, I won't be able to consume on my own. I have pickled some of the cucumbers, frozen many of the tomatoes, and given away much to different friends and family, and yet I still have a lot left over. I have taken much of my surplus with me to the 5 n 2 food pantry, to help those with food insecurity in the area. Many of us are blessed in many ways in this church and have abundance in our lives. We should take care of ourselves and our family, storing what we need to survive, but even then, many of us still have abundance left over. How do we use that abundance? Do we continue to hold onto it for ourselves even though we have enough, or do we use the gifts God gives us to serve others? In the future I am hoping to expand my garden and make space for members of the community to come and join me in learning from and working in nature. I hope to have some of you join me in this work soon.




TALENT SHOW
